## How Does This Little Pantry Work?

This little pantry is an easy way for neighbors to help neighbors who need food or hygiene items. They complement Food Banks with 24/7 barrier free access.

Even though its home is on this property, **this little pantry belongs to all of us**. Please take care of it and the space around it. Tidy the mini pantry if it needs it. If you can, clean up spills, and please don't litter.

**Give what you can** by placing non-perishable food or hygiene items inside the little pantry. Give what you would want to receive. An easy rule of thumb: buy extra of what you buy for your household. No gift is too small. A single can of soup can help. Items should be non-perishable, unexpired and in good condition.

**Take what you need.** If you find items inside and you need them, take them and know we care about you. Please remember the little pantry belongs to all of us and take only those items you need, trusting the little pantry will be here for you again.

**Items always in need.** Hearty soups/stews, peanut butter, canned meats, spaghetti sauce, granola bars, snacks, personal care items, baby food, etc.
